# **A Note from the Pastor**

When a certain great Rabbi saw misfortune threatening the Jews it was his custom to go into a certain part of the forest to meditate. There he would light a fire, say a prayer, and a miracle would be accomplished and the misfortune averted.

Later when his disciple had occasion to say the prayer, he would go to the same place in the forest and say "Master of the Universe, listen! I do not know how to light the fire, but I am still able to say the prayer." And, again, a miracle would be accomplished.

Still later, his disciple in order to save his people would go into the forest and say: "I do not know how to light the fire, I do not know the prayer, but I know the place, and this must be enough." Once again, a miracle saved the people.

Then it fell on the disciple of this disciple to overcome misfortune in the community. Sitting in his armchair, his head in his hands, he spoke to God: "I am unable to light the fire and I do not know the prayer; I cannot even find the place in the forest. All I can do is to tell the story, and this must be enough." And it was enough.

In the last month in our church we have prepared for the coming of Christ. We have prepared our church with beautiful decorations. We have sung some of our favorite songs. We have heard the story of Christ's coming shared in many different ways.

Together we have celebrated one of the greatest stories of our faith, the birth of Christ. Today let us be like the disciple who only knows the story for we were not there when the story happened. We were not around when the Early Church continued to tell the story. We may not all have the opportunity to journey where the story first happened.

But we can all continue to tell the story to those who may not have heard the story and we can all live out the story in our lives so that on Easter we will really have something to celebrate.
