As we prepare to enter in to 2024 I share with you this story entitled:

"The Gospel of the Second Chance"

On New Year's Day, 1929, Georgia Tech played University of California in the Rose Bowl. In that game a man named Roy Riegels recovered a fumble for California. Somehow, he became confused and started running in the wrong direction. One of his teammates, Benny Lom, overtook and chased him down the 65 yards and tackled him just before he scored a touchdown for Georgia Tech. When California attempted a punt, Tech blocked the kick and scored a safety, which at the end of the game was the margin of the victory.

That strange play came in the first half, and everyone who was watching the game was asking the same question: "What will Coach Nibbs Price do with Roy Riegels in the second half?" The men filed off the field and went into the dressing room. They sat down on the benches and on the floor, all but Riegels. He put his blanket around his shoulders, sat down in a corner, put his hands, and cried like a baby.

If you have played any sport, you know that a coach usually has a great deal to say to the team during halftime. That day Coach Price was quiet. No doubt he was trying to decide what to do with Riegels. Then the timekeeper came in and announced that there were three minutes before playing time. Coach Price looked at the team and said simply, "Men, the same team that played the first half will start the second."

The players got up and started out, all but Riegles. He did not budge. The coach looked back and called to him. Still he didn't move. Coach Price went over to where Riegels sat and said, "Roy, didn't you hear me? The same team that place the first half will start the second."

Then Roy looked up and his checks were wet with a strong man's tears. "Coach" he said, "I can't do it to save my life. I've ruined you. I've ruined the University of California. I've ruined myself. I couldn't face that crowd in the stadium to save my life."

The Coach Price reach out and put his hand on Riegels' shoulder and said "Get up and go back; the game is only half over." And Roy Riegels we back. Those Tech men will tell you they have never seen a man play football as Roy Riegels played that second half.

As we look back on the year 2023 we may see the places that we have stumbled and fallen. We may see the times we ran in the wrong direction. We see those places where we are ashamed of the choices we have made or maybe those we should have made and didn't.

But as we have traveled through this Advent Season we have prepared ourselves to meet Christ in the child who became a man and died on the cross for us, and we have prepared for the time when he will come again to this earth and make it once again his own.

So as we turn the calendar and enter into the New Year of 2024, and we think of all those things we want to change let us hear Jesus say to us; "Get up and go back for the game is only half over."

That is the grace of God who comes to us in the Holy Spirit and walks our life journey with us. That is the grace of God who gives us not only a second chance, but a third, a fourth, and a hundredth chance. That is the grace of God who is always offering us the forgiveness of that Christ Child who grew into a man, died on the cross taking on our sins and who rose again, for even death could not hold him down. This is the God we worship each and every Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday.
