

MESSAGE FROM THE PEC COMMITTEE

Just a reminder from the PEC Committee that persons/groups receiving PEC grant awards in 2023 have until February 29, 2024, to use those funds. Unused funds remaining at that time will be returned to the endowment funds and may be included in funds to be awarded in 2024.

The deadline for turning in applications to the PEC committee for consideration of 2024 grants is February 29, 2024. Completed applications may be placed in the PEC mail slot just inside the door of Court Chapel, they may be mailed to the church, or they may be emailed to Nancy Beenblossom at nlb217@gmail.com

Applications will be accepted even if they are not completed on a formal application blank. They must include the following information:

- Name of Person/Organization Submitting Application
- · Value of Grant being requested
- Purpose of the need for the grant
- Contact information (name, phone number and/or email address) for the person who can be reached regarding the grant application

Any person/organization wanting to know how many funds they have remaining in the account from their 2023 grant awards may contact Barb Hamlyn.

We want to encourage any person and/or organization who has a financial need that falls under the requirements of the PEC Guidelines to complete an application and submit it for consideration.



The January UWF meeting was held on Thursday, January 4th at 1:00 PM in Court Chapel with ten members present.

Prayer concerns were shared for church members and friends.

Correspondence was multiple thank yous from area organizations for our year end donations and a funeral thank you from the families of two church members. Multiple get well and sympathy cards have been sent since our last meeting.

Circle Reports were given. Mary Deborah Circle met in the chapel and discussed lunch for today's meeting, held election of officers, and provided Sunday School treats. Naomi Circle met to put up the Angel Tree. Rebecca Circle had a potluck and revealed their Secret Pals.

The Piecemakers have 8 baby quilts completed and two more in the process. Plans are to have 10 blessed and delivered soon. There are still craft items and cookbooks for sale. A another cookbook was sold in December.

Janesville Days for 2024 (175th) was discussed. Members are to bring any suggestions for the event to future meetings. Members expressed that we have members with commitments to multiple organizations but felt we should have a presence either physical or monetary for the event.

A report was given on the Rebecca Circle Veteran's dinner in November. Approximately 45 people were served.

A report was given on the Angel Tree fundraiser. \$1245 was collected and distributed with \$720 going to the Janesville School, \$160 to Waverly Shell Rock School, and \$365 to North Cedar School for their reduced cost lunch programs. In kind donations were \$634 with North Star receiving \$263 worth, Janesville School receiving \$133 worth, and Bremwood receiving #237.50 worth.

A report was given on Jingle in Janesville. Members were very generous with their donations of food items. Attendance was lower this year and the location was not optimal so sales were down. Leftover items were sold in church the following Sunday and donations were generous.

A leftover turkey roast was donated to a needy family in Waverly along with a jar of cranberry relish and some rolls. The family was very appreciative.

There is a change in the District's annual requested donations for the area missions. Instead of donating \$1 per member for Bidwell Riverside and for Hawthorne Hill, we are asked to donate \$2 per member for Families Forward which will support the two missions. The requested \$1 per member for Mission U remains the same. The total amount per member remains the same as previous years-just will be reported differently.

With the rising costs of supplies, our funeral fee was discussed. A motion was made and carried to raise our fee to \$150 plus the cost of food. This will be brought to the Ad Council meeting on Sunday.

JUMP will be making 150 pies again for a sorority fundraiser. Pie making dates are Wednesday, January 10th and Monday, January 15th both at 9:00 AM. Additional dates will be determined later. All are welcome, experience not required. A church family donated 10# of flour and sugar to be used for pies. They also donated 6# of walnuts that will probably be sold.

Installation of officers was conducted with a service provided by Pastor Laurie who was unable to attend the meeting.

Our next meeting will be February 1st at 1:00 P.M. Mary Deborah Circle will have devotions. Rebecca Circle will hostess. Program to be announced.

Naomi Circle provided a Prayer and Self Denial program and an offering was taken. Members not present are welcome to donate. The donations need to be to the treasurer by the first of March.





2023 Angel Tree Update

The Angel Tree has been put away for another year and all donations received have been disbursed. We are calling it a blessed, successful endeavor. Physical items received and gifted to North Star, Bremwood and Janesville School had an estimated value of \$634.00. Monetary gifts received and gifted to Janesville School, North Cedar School and Waverly-Shell Rock Schools totaled \$1,445.00 to be used to supplement their "At-Need Lunch Programs." The grand total received was \$2,079.00.

Ash Wednesday is on February 14 this year.

Due to Valentine's Day and Pastor Laurie just returning from vacation, we will not be having an Ash Wednesday Worship Service.

Instead, take some time to contemplate Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten Season.

From Wikipedia:

Ash Wednesday is a holy day of prayer and fasting in many Western Christian denominations. It is preceded by Shrove Tuesday and marks the first day of Lent, the six weeks of penitence before Easter.

Ash Wednesday is observed by Catholics, Lutherans, Moravians, Anglicans, Methodists, Nazarenes, as well as by some churches in the Reformed tradition, including certain Congregationalist, Continental Reformed, and Presbyterian churches.

Ash Wednesday is traditionally observed with fasting and abstinence from meat in a number of Christian denominations. As it is the first day of Lent, many Christians begin Ash Wednesday by marking a Lenten calendar, praying a Lenten daily devotional, and making a Lenten sacrifice that they will not partake of until the arrival of Eastertide.

Many Christians attend special Ash Wednesday church services, at which churchgoers receive ash on their foreheads. Ash Wednesday derives its name from this practice, in which the placement of ashes is accompanied by the words, "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or the dictum "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." The ashes are prepared by burning palm leaves from the previous year's Palm Sunday celebrations.




May your Ash Wednesday be a time of reflection and promise.
