A Note from the Pastor

On Good Friday, which this year is April 7th , I am inviting you to join me for an Agape supper and worship service. This service will begin at 6:00pm and go about an hour. This service will take place in the fellowship area so it will not be recorded.

Now, you may wonder what an Agape supper is so let me share some info with you. The Agape Meal is a Christian fellowship meal recalling the meals Jesus shared with disciples during his ministry. The modern history of the Love Feast began when Count Zinzendorf and the Moravians in Germany introduced a service of sharing food, prayer, religious conversation, and hymns in 1727. John Wesley first experienced it among the Moravians in Savannah, Georgia, ten years later. His diary notes: "After evening prayers, we joined with the Germans in one of their love—feasts. It was begun and ended with thanksgiving and prayer, and celebrated in so decent and solemn a manner as a Christian of the apostolic age would have allowed to be worthy of Christ."

It quickly became a feature of the Evangelical Revival and a regular part of Methodist society meetings in Great Britain and throughout the English—speaking world. As Methodists immigrated to North America they made Love Feasts an important part of early American Methodism.

The Love Feast includes the sharing of food and it is customary not to use communion bread, wine, or grape juice because to do so might confuse the Love Feast with the Lord's Supper. The bread may be a loaf of ordinary bread, crackers, rolls, or sweet bread baked especially for this service. The beverage has usually been water, but other beverages such as lemonade, juice, tea, or coffee can be used. Early Methodists commonly passed a loving cup with two handles from person to person, but later the water was served in individual glasses. The food is served quietly without interrupting the service.

During the meal, there may be informal conversation in Christian fellowship, or the leader may direct the conversation by suggesting matters of mutual concern, or there may be spontaneous witnessing and praise. If there is food left over, it may be taken as an expression of love to persons not present.

At our Agape supper, I am inviting each of you to bring something to share with all who gather together. The items do not need to be large -- fruit or crackers, or breads, or cheese or sausage, olive, pickled herring, deviled eggs, cookies; you get the idea – a finger food or simple food pot luck. All who want to come are invited to come; this includes children, if parents want to include them in this service.

I will begin the service; we will enjoy a simple meal together, I will serve Holy Communion (the only major difference between this meal and an actual Agape meal) and then I will conclude the service.

I hope you can join me for this special worship service on Good Friday as we remember all that Christ did for us during Holy Week so we can have an Easter to celebrate.



What is UMCOR & How is it Funded?

Wikipedia says, "The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) is the global humanitarian aid and development organization of the United Methodist Church (UMC). UMCOR is a nonprofit 501(c)3 organization operated under the auspices of the General Board of Global Ministries. One hundred percent of donations are directed to an earmarked project or relief effort. Administrative expenses are funded by an annual offering collected by United Methodist churches on UMCOR Sunday.

UMCOR works through programs that address hunger, poverty, sustainable agriculture, international and domestic emergencies, refugee and immigrant concerns, global health issues, and transitional development. These programs are categorized into three major areas: Humanitarian Relief / Disaster Response, Sustainable Development and Global Health (in collaboration with UM Global Ministries)."

Ideas for programs are needed. It was suggested to ask Linda McCann to come back and speak about another one of her books.


Videos of the new mission kit instructions were shown. Copies of the new instructions were distributed. The prayer cards that need to be included this year are being printed.
