Pastor Audrey Westendorf is retiring. Our last day with her is <u>Sunday</u>, <u>June 6</u>.



Dear JUMC family from Pastor Audrey:)

When I came here, I intended to joyfully serve these two churches for 4-5 years, unless my health interfered. It has.



Speaking, singing, and visiting on the phone have all become increasingly painful. Rather than serving God and you poorly, I am retiring in June. Your prayers are appreciated for me, the SPRC as they meet with D.S. Moody Colorado; and our incoming pastor (& family.) I don't currently know the date of their first Sunday with us.

This is my last official "letter" to you. It reminds me of all the letters that must have been written in the days of the early church. They make up most of the New Testament under the titles of the receiving churches: Romans; (1 & 2) Corinthians;

Galatians; Ephesians; Philippians; Colossians; Thessalonians; Hebrews and fellow pastors to whom they were written: Timothy; Titus; Philemon; James; (1 & 2) Peter; (1, 2, & 3) John; Jude and even including the Revelation of John.

I considered every letter and email I wrote to you an important communication; at least as important as the letters I frequently exchanged with my parents and sisters about our lives when we lived apart and pay-by-the-minute-phone calls were avoided. I was surprised to hear that some of you also expected phone calls during COVID, when I had frequently communicated by email and letter-writing; with many of you on-line in social media and certainly, through my hour-long messages on Sunday mornings.

Especially since you all know I live alone, I wondered why more of you didn't call to check on me. It's apparently all a huge misunderstanding. Is it true that church members still believe that pastors have built-in intuition as to when a church family member needs a call? 'Tain't so, my Dears.

James 5:11-16 "You have heard of Job's perseverance and have seen what the Lord finally brought about for him. The Lord is full of compassion and mercy. Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them pray. Is anyone happy? Let them sing songs of praise. Is anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them in the name of the Lord. If they have sinned they will be forgiven.

Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective."

Your new pastor will very much appreciate your calls to him or her and especially being alerted to times you, or someone you know, are in need of pastoral care. And be willing to allow your SPRC folk to share your name when you have a concern. It causes great harm to complain and then with your secrecy close the circle of restoration that could happen.

So many folk no longer have land-lines and the church hasn't been able to keep up with all the updates. We even had the wrong church number on our church website for several months. Barb and Rita can't do it all alone, anymore than a pastor alone can. We need your usable phone numbers.

Our lives have been forced to change in so very many ways this past year. I hope and pray that you will do all you can to assist your incoming pastor (and family) in every positive way possible by adjusting well to church family life in our post-pandemic world. It may not be easy, but it will be so valuable. You can always say, "Blame it on COVID!" Then forgive and forget. I leave you with this benediction from the inspired Word of God:

"May the God of PEACE, who through the blood of the eternal covenant, brought back from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, equip you with everything good for doing His will, and may He work in us what is pleasing to Him, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen."

Report of the Joint Hudson and Janesville Staff-Parish Relations

Committee (SPRC)

Met in May with District Superintendent Moody Colorado to plan for our transition of pastors. Rev Moody announced that Pastor Audrey's last day with us is Sunday, June 6, after which she has two weeks and two Sundays of paid vacation remaining for this Conference year.

Colorado stated that, by UMDiscipline, the SPRC is in charge during this transition period, including securing guest speakers for Sunday mornings.

If there is need for urgent pastoral care or a funeral, contact Nancy Beenblossom, SPRC chair, a retired social worker by profession, who will help you and know who to contact. Funerals do not, by law, need to be performed by an ordained clergy.

At that meeting, it was discovered that there are no UMClergy-persons available in lowa at this time and that we, along with 4-6 other UMChurches in our District, (as well as others in the lowa Conference) will have lay ministers/speakers as pulpit supply until "late" appointments can be made.

The next week the Bishop sent a prayer request to all Iowa UMChurches for Rev Moody who was undergoing triple bypass open heart surgery at Allen Hospital last Friday.

A District Committee headed by Cedar Falls FUMC, Rev Scott Koobler, was formed and meets June 1st, to match up certified Lay ministers/speakers with churches, at least for the summer, while Rev. Colorado recovers and "late" appointments can be made.

Members of the Joint SPRC include Hudson's Diane Schulz, Nancy Louthan, Fay Munchoff, Nancy Patterson, and Janesville's Chuck Immerzeel, Emily Megan, Cindy Dobbs, and Chpn Nancy Beenblossom."



Mission u 2021 offers these studies: Finding Peace in an Anxious World 2021 Spiritual Growth Mission Study


