JUMC & Iowa UMConference begin On-Line Giving Opportunity

A link has been created on the lowa UMConference website. Our church name is included in a drop-down list. The donor can leave a comment for specific instructions to the church.

Total gifts will be direct deposited to church's bank account twice-a-month.

Below are some answers to questions we have received regarding the local church online giving option:

- 1. Will it cost the church anything for this service? The Conference is prepared to allow churches to use the online giving for three months without any fees being deducted from the local church gift total. The Treasurer's Office/Administrative Services will pick up those costs. After June 30, the fees are .30 per transaction plus approximately 2.9% which is the amount charged to the Conference for the service.
- 3. How will the church know when a gift is made? The system, will automatically send an email to the church each time a gift is receive. The donor may use an online comment section to designate their gift. Any comments made will be included in the email.
- **4.** How will potential donors see where to give? The online form is pictured to the right here.
- 8. Is this a secure site to donate through? The lowa Conference page is handled through Braintree (a Pay Pal company) which is a secure encrypted site. At no time does any credit card information stay within the lowa Conference system. The banking information that our church would submit to our office would be entered into the bank ACH portal and then securely stored.



UMW News

In early May Pastor Audrey notified us of a grant for community projects that was available through the Conference UMW. She suggested we try to get a grant for the free lunch program at the community center. One of the requirements for the application was a "date of approval" from our unit. Since we were not able to have a meeting, a telephone vote of the Executive Board members.

We are pleased to announce that we received a check for \$1,000. That's enough to fund at least 5 weeks of meals! We will be preparing a report for the grant committee which we will share with our members as well.

For those of you that are unaware of this program, it was started in December of 2019 by the manager of the community center, Dan Phillips. It started as a free lunch to anyone in the community twice a month. This spring the free lunches were increased to once a week with the school age children and many additional adults at home due to the virus issues. Dan does the cooking and distributes the meals through takeout or delivery with community volunteers. 300 meals are currently distributed each week.

<u>lowa Conference United Methodist</u> <u>Women</u> has awarded *Be Bold* grants to several local units to be used for community projects that will enhance the Purpose of UMW.

The grants were made possible by a planned gift to Iowa Conference UMW from the late Barbara Csomay of Kanawha. She was a retired music teacher and marching band instructor, and a member of Kanawha United Methodist Church.

The grants were to be awarded later in 2020, but are being awarded on a shortened timetable to help meet the needs of communities affected by the Covid-19 pandemic. Additional grants may be awarded for calendar year 2020; the deadline for applications to be received is May 15.

Recipients include:

- Sioux Rapids First UMW, \$1,000 to provide assistance to the Sioux Rapids Food Pantry.
- West Union UMW, \$1,000 to provide assistance to the Open Hands Food Ministry of the North Fayette Valley Ministers Association.
- Center Chapel UMW, \$1,000 to provide assistance to the Helping Hand food pantry in Indianola.
 Archer UMW, \$1,000 to provide assistance to the Sheldon Summer Lunch Program.
