This tradition has declined in the past years, and we are trying to start it up again as a special fund raiser and just another way to Praise God for all the blessings of another year!







The Bremer County Health Department Foot Clinics are available to individuals 55 years of age or older and/or individuals who are significantly disabled and unable to manage their own foot care.

The foot clinics offer general foot care and diabetic foot care which includes:

- Foot assessment
- Warm foot soak
- Trimming of nails/calluses using clippers or dremel
- Lotion application/gentle massage
- Education on proper foot care

This service is \$30 per visit. Cash or check only.
