




This month's special Craft Corner offering are these fun and functional catnip mice to keep your kitties entertained.

Thanks to your generosity during our June/July fundraiser, **\$125** was donated to help this cause.



What better way for God to call us than to ring the church bell on Sunday mornings, saying to our community, "Come worship with us"?

Our church has been blessed with a beautiful, historic bell that we are able to ring on Sunday mornings before

worship. Unfortunately, we are unable to get volunteers who are willing, available, and/or able to consistently ring our bell every Sunday morning.

Our Usher Committee and Tech Committee have researched and will be purchasing an electronic bell ringing device for the church. This device will be set to automatically ring the bell at any designated time, eliminating the need for someone to go out into the weather to manually ring the bell.

The company that sells these devices has assured us that the chances of this device being struck and destroyed by lightening are minimal. We will, however, choose to invest in a surge protector to protect this electronic system, in case the unexpected would happen.

The cost of this device is \$6,476. This price includes a control box, the exterior clapper, and a surge protector. Installation would be an additional \$2,500.

We are currently asking for donations to help cover the cost of the bell ringer and installation. If you wish to donate, it may be sent to the church or placed in the offering plate on Sundays. Be sure to label your check "bell ringer".

Please pray on this and do whatever God leads you to do. We hope to be able to complete this project by the end of fall before the weather starts getting colder.
