Another suggestion is to continue our 2020 goals into the 2021 year. Along with that idea, would the leadership be willing to continue another year by extending terms and just not count 2020? If not, please let us know as soon as possible.

Lincoln's now-famous "house divided" line was drawn from Matthew 12 in the **Bible**, "Every kingdom divided against itself is brought to desolation, and every city or house divided against itself will not stand.
