Dear JUMC Family, Holy Week services are subject to postponing, but not cancelling.

Have you heard the message,



It refers to the Crucifixion of Jesus on Good Friday, His facing sin, death, and hell over Holy Saturday and His Glorious Resurrection on Easter Morning.

This year, with the new coronavirus during flu and cold season, "Friday" has come early. Even the season of Lent has been stolen from us and perhaps Easter Sunday being held on April 12 has too.

Actually every Sunday morning is a "Little Easter" because on each we are reminded of Christ's gift of forgiveness and eternal life through His actions 2000 years ago, but even those have been temporarily taken from us.

I'm proposing we celebrate Easter in 2020 on the Sunday we choose, after this virus threat passes and we can meet in groups again.

My "Friday" concerns include how this unusual virus season is going to affect our mental and spiritual health. Remaining home and inside, will avoid exposure to viruses, but slights us emotionally. This is not a winter storm when we must remain inside to be safe. It's okay for us to go outdoors, while practicing six foot social distancing to avoid sharing infectious diseases with each other. And not gather in large groups at all. This all makes sense for many reasons.

It's good for us to go outdoors for a walk and to play. Science and common sense tell us that physical exercise increases our feel-good hormones to help combat the depression that may set in otherwise. Getting regular rest, eating nutritionally and moving around through-out the day indoors, helps too. Visiting on the phone and social media will help us remain connected with one another. No one should face this unusual season alone.

While reading God's Word, the Bible, and pausing to listen to God through prayer and meditation each day. God will guide us to what it is we need to hear from God. The Old Testament Psalms and Prophets tell of Bible times when life was tougher than we have it today and how God carried His people through it all. Let those stories bring you hope.

Reading the New Testament gospels, Matthew, Mark, Luke or John, will bring us all the hope we need to face any circumstances. 

Distribution of Sowing \$20 Seeds

There are for you Hy-Vee and Kwik Star cards in the office to stop by and purchase Monday-Thursday mornings. When you purchase Kwik Star & Hy-Vee gift cards (aka scrip) through our church, you receive cards for the face value of your purchases. As a fundraiser for the church, in addition, our church receives 5% for all Kwik Star purchases and 3% for all Hy-Vee purchases. An added bonus - if you use your Kwik Star card INSIDE the store, our church receives an additional 10% of the value of that purchase.



Apportionments are "A Portion Meant for Others"

If you have not yet received your "church bank," you can pick up one at the church. Please write your name on the bottom of your bank if you want credit for giving.

We encourage you to take a bank home and put it in a prominent spot where you regularly see it and be reminded to drop your loose change (and bills, if you like) into it. Checks are also welcome.

On the Third Sunday of each month, "A Portion Meant for Others" Offering opportunity will be given to bring your banks and checks to worship.

You can empty your bank into a baggie with your name on it or you can bring your bank to church and we'll empty it, record your donation and return your bank to you the same day, so you can receive credit on your giving statement.

Apportionments are <u>"A Portion Meant for Others."</u> This money will help to pay our 2020 apportionments, which are used to help others.

For What Are Some Apportionments Spent in Iowa?

Commission on Ministries with Persons with Disabilities strives to heighten awareness of disability issues in the Iowa Conference and local UMChurches. It is a resource to District Church Location & Building committees and provides seed grants for funding for the improvement of accessibility to buildings and activities.

Commission on Religion and Race monitors, evaluates, advocates, empowers, and tries to enable the church in all levels to pursue and achieve racial inclusivity as a way of life.

Commission on the Status and Role of Women advocates for women to claim their rightful place within the church and in society.

Council on Age Level Ministries encourages the church to include all ages in planning, implementation and participation in programs as well as sensitivity to the needs, interests, and abilities of all individuals and families.

District Councils on Ministry provide local churches access to needed resources, provides training along with spiritual formation events for leaders of local churches and identifies potential areas of ministry growth within the district.

Matthew 25 Fund provides grants to mission and ministry programs within each district to assist local churches engage directly in hands-on ministry which propels us as the body of Christ towards the Kingdom of God.

Palm Sunday is **UMCOR Sunday**! Gifts given on this Sunday cover the costs of doing business so UMCOR can respond when and where it is needed most, working to alleviate human suffering and advance hope and healing. [Copy and paste blue print in search box for more information.]

For more than 50 years, United Methodist congregations have been taking part in a special offering, laying the foundation for the <u>United Methodist Committee on Relief's ministry</u> of relief and hope. UMCOR's work of alleviating human suffering around the world includes disaster relief and supplies, disaster risk reduction, health, and humanitarian development.

Gifts to the <u>UMCOR Sunday offering</u> (formerly One Great Hour of Sharing) cover

the costs of doing business. This helps UMCOR keep the promise that 100 percent of any gift to a specific UMCOR project will go toward that project, not administrative costs. UMCOR has no source of revenue for administration except from UMCOR Sunday.

Because of UMCOR Sunday, when you hear about a disaster or humanitarian crisis and you give to UMCOR, you can be assured that 100%, of the money you designate goes toward people in need.

Most congregations celebrate UMCOR Sunday on the fourth Sunday in Lent (March 22 in 2020), but it can be celebrated at another time if a congregation wishes, like Palm Sunday, which has been our JUMC tradition.

We received the 5 Star Mission Certificate again this year.

March 23 is the 151st Anniversary of the UMW and a motion was made and carried that our unit donate \$23.00 towards the Legacy Fund.
