

Pastor Audrey Westendorf: I can't imagine doing anything else By Anelia K. Dimitrova.

It's somewhat unusual to look into a pastor's soul through the prism of their life.

Perhaps because the reverends are the ones delivering the message, in times of rejoicing and in times of sorrow for others, one tends to forget that pastors, too, have to tread through the peaks and valleys of their own lives.

And yet, through it all, they are tasked with finding the inner fortitude to uplift those who lean on them in moments of weakness and hardship.

But how does one find the path to pastorship? How does one know when to embark on it, and perhaps most poignantly, how does one know that preaching the message and offering solace to strangers is their true vocation?

Many a pastor-hopeful, no doubt, has wrestled with these questions and more.

But for Audrey Westendorf, the new pastor at Janesville's United Methodist Church, that revelation came at a time of a big loss.

She was 43 years old in 1995 when her husband, Gary, then a worker at Beatrice Cheese in Fredericksburg, died of a heart attack, leaving her and their adult children, Matthew and Melissa, bereft.



In the midst of grief, compounded by the suddenness and the finality of the loss she had a revelation.

"God did a clear call to me to ministry," she said, reflecting on the moment.

The affirming message seemed to come repeatedly not only through coping with her own feelings but also through the seemingly serendipitous comments that flowed her way from her own pastor and family and friends.

At that time, she volunteered as an officer at the local church and had held various offices in the lowa United Methodist Church.

Throughout this time, a thought kept

crossing her mind: "Gee I wish I could do this volunteer work full time," she recalled thinking.

Within a year of her husband's death, she was already at the pulpits at the Lenox and Mercer Center United Methodist Churches in Lenox, Iowa. She was also attending St Paul School of Theology in Leawood, Kansas.

The death of her husband was not the first time Pastor Audrey had dealt with loss. When she was 27, her mother, Leona, passed away at the age of 58.

"If you don't grieve, grief has a way of sneaking up on you months or years later," she said. Pastor Audrey Westendorf joined the United Methodist Church in Janesville in the summer as the new pastor.

She also conducts 9 am Sunday services at the United Methodist Church in Hudson.

It's an advice Pastor Audrey shares with grieving families at all times, as she has experienced it herself.

But its resonance is especially magnified during the holiday season, she adds.

On Friday, Pastor Audrey comfortingly repeated that message for the grieving family of Leslie Margaret Beebe, the 48 year old editor,, writer and philanthropist whose parents George and Kathleen Beebe, grew up in Waverly, where Leslie spent many a happy summer and was laid to rest at Harlington Cemetery.

A tall woman with a girlish, somewhat prankish laugh, and an operatic, soulful singing voice, Pastor Audrey exudes calm.

What was particularly soothing about her message on Friday, during the service was its measured tone, at times light hearted, at times profound in its gravity, but always existentially relevant.

"Don't skip on the grieving, it is really necessary," Pastor Audrey said during Leslie's funeral service at Kaiser Corson Funeral Home in Waverly.

After all, as Pastor Audrey herself can attest, grief can have an enlightening and cleansing power.

In a cruel twist of fate, in 2001, her brother, Bill, who was just about to become president of the board of his United Church of Christ, rural Waverly, died in a snowmobile accident in Michigan, adding more grief to Pastor Audrey's heart.

That Audrey decided to pursue ministry in widowhood was not really that surprising, given that she grew up in the church, going to Faith United Church of Christ in Tripoli. Her dad, H.H. Hildebrandt, was a dairy and crop farmer in Bremer County, and her mom, Leona, took care of the family's four kids and the house and everything else that needed caring. Faith was an important pillar in the Hildebrandt household.


Pastor Audrey's two sisters, Janet and Joann, are retired United Methodist pastors.

Born in Sumner, graduating from Tripoli High School in 1969, Pastor Audrey said pastoring reenergized her and helped her repurpose her path.

Like many a rural pastor, she serves two congregations —in Hudson for a 9 am worship on Sundays and in Janesville for the 10:30 am service.

"The joy and the satisfaction of doing this work is indescribable. I am 68, and I could have retired, but can't imagine doing anything else," she said.

A book more than ten years in the making is finally coming to life. Years ago, when I left the call I had at Janesville, I wrote down a number of the stories from that time so that I would have a record of the transformation, healing and renewal we shared in at that congregation. Approxi-

mately five years ago, I took those stories off the shelf, read through them, and realized that the time had come to get serious about pulling things together for a book.

In 2015, I sent the manuscript off to a small publishing house. The book was accepted by the publishing house, but then got "stuck in production," as they say in the business, and it sat there with CSS Publishing for a while.

Finally, in the summer of 2019 the book was published. I've done a soft roll -out with colleagues and friends, but now in November, the public will have a chance to get their copy.



Two book signings are in the works. The first one will be at St. Timothy on Sunday, Nov. 10, from 1:30-3 p.m. Cost will be \$15. The second will be Saturday, Nov. 16, 1:30-3 at St. Paul's Lutheran Church and School in Waverly. Snacks and beverages will be available in both places.

What's the book about? Here are a few chapter titles as teasers: "From Snowforts to Glowsticks," "The Body of Christ, Living Care Packages," "Outside the Comfort Zones: Stewardship and Other Lessons."

The "elevator speech" is this: God is always willing to match a congregation's enthusiasm for mission and ministry. That was certainly the case at Janesville, where they faced a future that was pretty bleak.

They didn't know, for example, if they would see one another from week to week because they weren't sure the church would be open the following week. But following the healing interim ministry of a husband-wife duo that loved the congregation back to life, they reached the point where they were ready to call a pastor for a regular call.

My family and I were fortunate to be the ones called to serve at Messiah. During the course of our 9.5 years together, we did some remarkable things together. But the time to leave came, and so we stepped aside. The book talks about that, too.

The lessons I learned from "the little congregation that dared" have stayed with me all these years. I wrote the book because I thought other congregations might be able to learn from what we, with God's guidance and persistent belief in us, were able to do. Some of those lessons have informed my time at St. Timothy, too.
