


According to facebook statistics for both the Janesville and Hudson fb pages, we have been viewed over 100 times for nearly every worship service since the pandemic began.

Financial Update!

Thanks to a special PPP (Paycheck Protection Program) loan from the government, due to the COVID-19 crisis, to use for salaries in April and May, we have been able to pay our bills and maintain a balance in our General Fund to continue paying bills.

As long as we can show that we used at least 75% of the PPP loan for salaries (which we did), the loan should be forgiven and we should not have to repay it.

All of your offerings are greatly appreciated and will continue to be used to pay bills throughout this crisis period.

JUMC & Iowa UMConference begin On-Line Giving Opportunity

A link has been created on the lowa UMConference website. Our church name is included in a drop-down list. The donor can leave a comment for specific instructions to the church.

Total gifts will be direct deposited to church's bank account twice-a-month.

Below are some answers to questions we have received regarding the local church online giving option:

- 1. Will it cost the church anything for this service? The Conference is prepared to allow churches to use the online giving for three months without any fees being deducted from the local church gift total. The Treasurer's Office/Administrative Services will pick up those costs. After June 30, the fees are .30 per transaction plus approximately 2.9% which is the amount charged to the Conference for the service.
- 3. How will the church know when a gift is made? The system, will automatically send an email to the church each time a gift is receive. The donor may use an online comment section to designate their gift. Any comments made will be included in the email.
- **4.** How will potential donors see where to give? The online form is pictured to the right here.
- 5. Is this a secure site to donate through? The lowa Conference page is handled through Braintree (a Pay Pal company) which is a secure encrypted site. At no time does any credit card information stay within the lowa Conference system. The banking information that our church would submit to our office would be entered into the bank ACH portal and then securely stored.



EXAMPLE OF A FACEBOOK POST OF A LUTHERAN PASTOR TRYING TO COMMUNICATE RE-OPENING THE CHURCH

Maybe you can tell that pastors are really stressed about opening the church buildings. Here is why. It's very easy to say—open your doors! Here is what that means in order to keep everyone safe:

Recommendations/Requirements for Opening for Worship, THAT DO NOT EVEN INCLUDE ALL THE UNITED METHODIST ONES.

If we were to go forward with opening up for worship what would that look like? What does social distancing look like in a worship setting?

Under the guidance of the CDC, our insurance company, and Lutheran Disaster Team for Northeast, Iowa, the following is a list of what absolutely everyone would have to agree to and abide by, if we reopen the church for worship at this time (May 31, 2020.)

The following is a list of things we would have to do and not do in order to keep everyone as safe as possible and still practice proper social distancing.

- Members would only be able to enter the building from the North door and exit only from the south and west doors. (Keep in mind this might be a very long walk back to your cars in potentially bad weather)
- Body temperatures would be checked on everyone before entering the building
- Clear paths would have to be marked on the floors for entrance, exit, etc... so persons may maintain at least 6 foot of distance from one another
- Pews would be marked with colored tape since we can't wipe down the padded pews and know that they are safe. Fredsville is large enough that we would have to have more than one service
- Members would need to sit in assigned seating and only in their family groups (of those who live within the same household) Children may not sit with friends and/or grandparents. Children must remain in their pew with their family group. Assigned seating would be minimally every other pew, in your own family groups, and at least 6 feet away from the next person.

- There would be no Fellowship time. No coffee, treats, etc...
 - · There would be no singing
 - There would be no Holy Communion
- There would be no Passing the Peace, greeters, bulletins, or shaking hands or hugging
 - There would be no passing of offering plates
- Hymnals and ALL items would be removed from the pews
 - There would be no Children's Sermon
- Children must stay with their family and will not be able to mingle with friends or even grandparents and others that they do not live with (this includes before and after worship)
 - · There will be no Sunday School
- The bathrooms will be closed (we can not guarantee that the bathrooms would be cleaned between each person
- We would ask that if you are in the High Risk category and/or have a pre-existing condition, that you remain at home and continue worshiping with us on-line
- No one would be allowed to gather or sit in the Gathering Space
- We would have to have multiple worship services with a time to clean in between the services (who would do this cleaning?)
- Everyone would be required to wear masks and gloves would be recommended
- We would maintain an online worship presence
 - · We would not run fans or air conditioning
- Between services we would clean all doors, pews, hand railings, any and all surfaces that could have been touched. (UMC:+3 hours)

As you can see, there is a great deal that needs to go into thinking about reopening, and to be as honest as I can with you, I seriously doubt our ability to have every member, regardless of their age, to be compliant with each of these items. Just one person adult or child who does not follow these guidelines simply puts everyone at risk. (Copied with permission.)

Iowa UMConference is continuing to update the policies as the coronavirus risks change. JUMC and HUMC are both checking with insurance companies to see requirements for coverage when we have in-house worship again.
